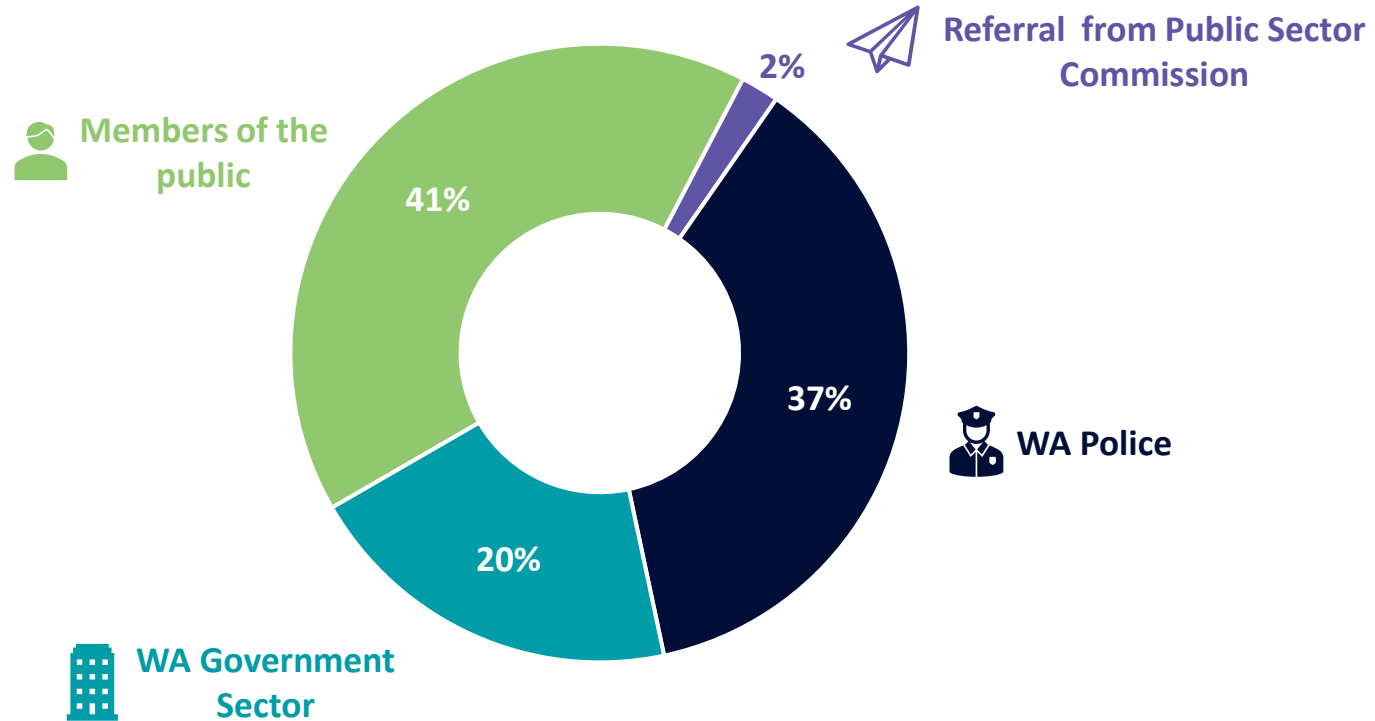

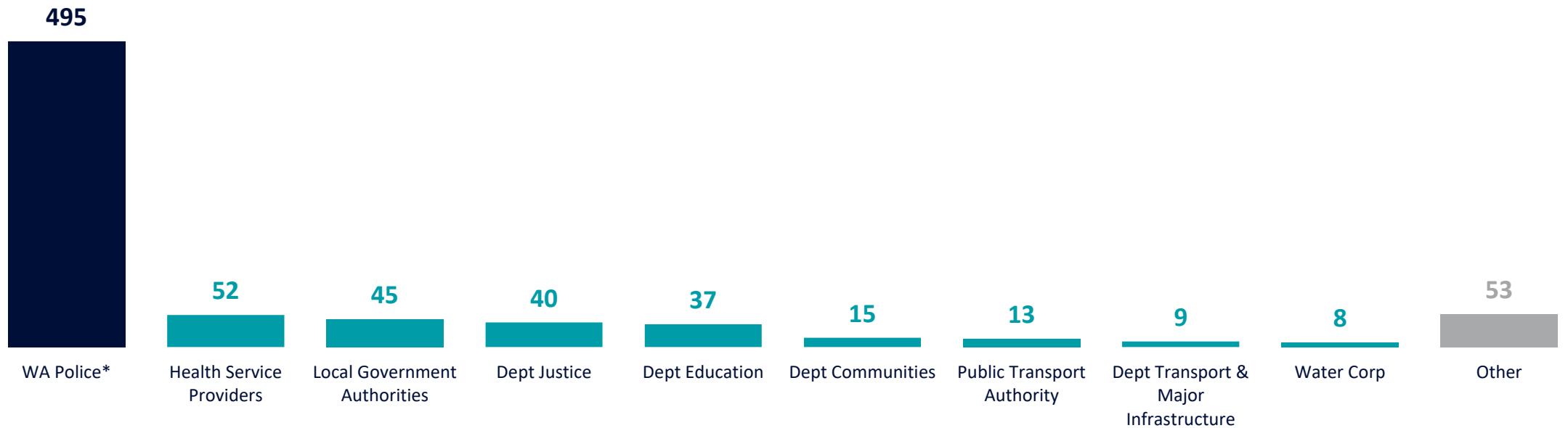
Reports and Notifications - Source

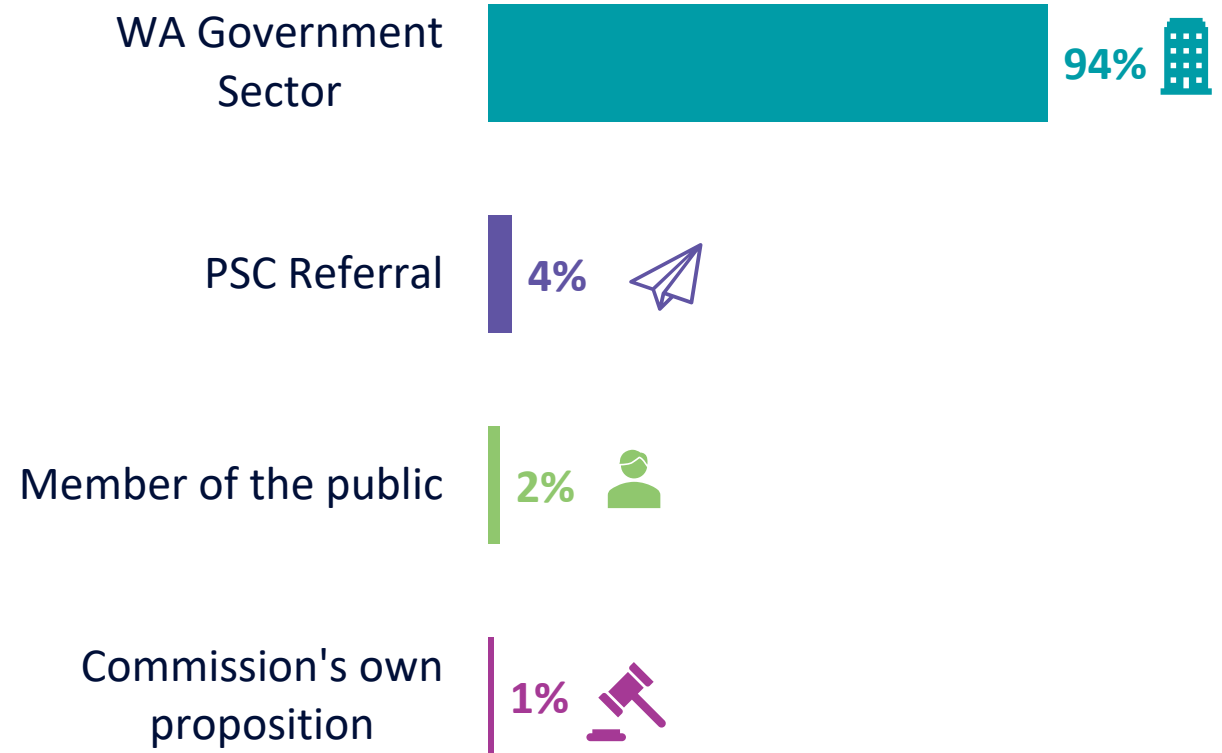

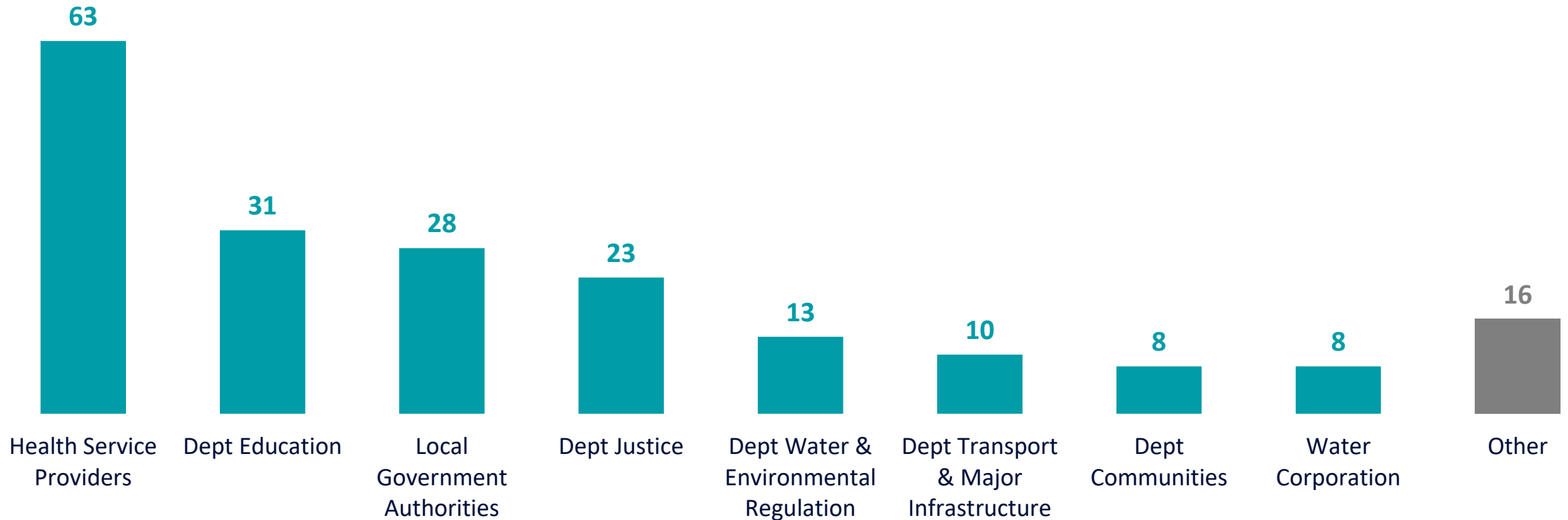


Source of suspected serious misconduct allegations





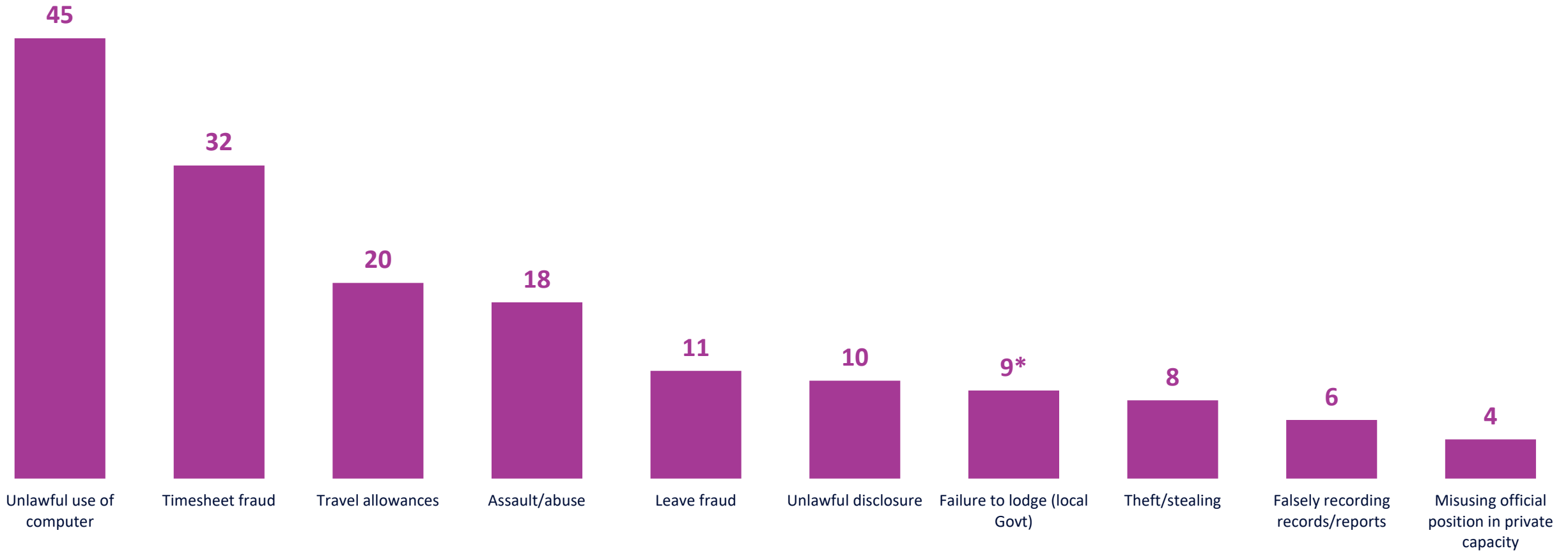
Suspected serious misconduct allegations by subject officer agency

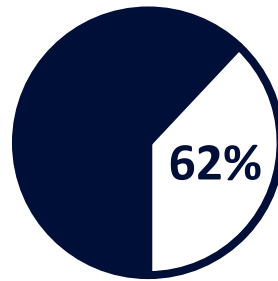

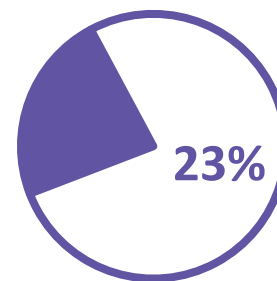

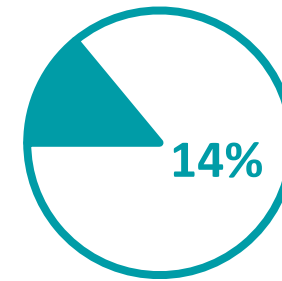

There are several considerations applied by the Commission when deciding whether to take action:

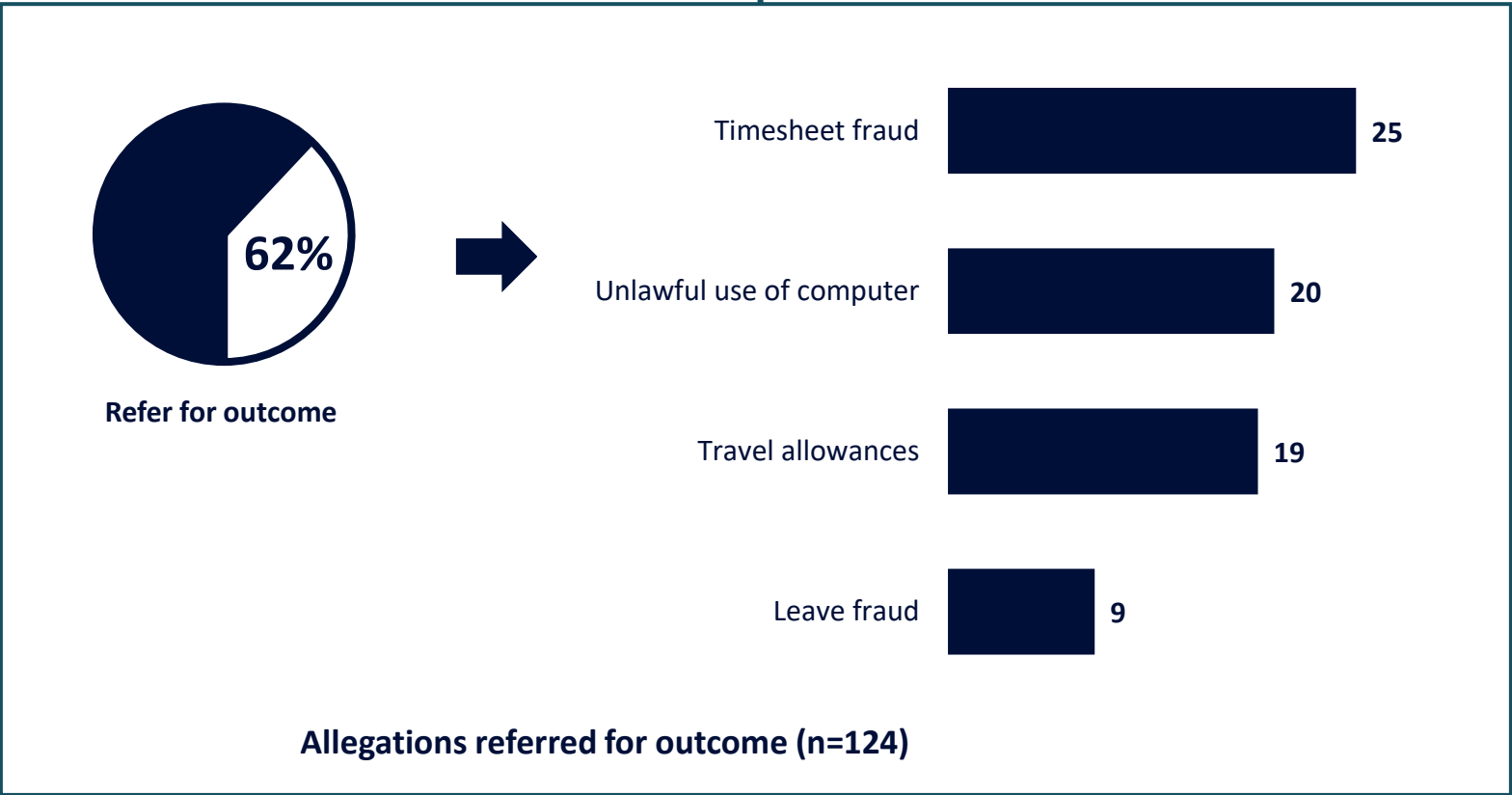
- seriousness of the conduct

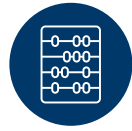

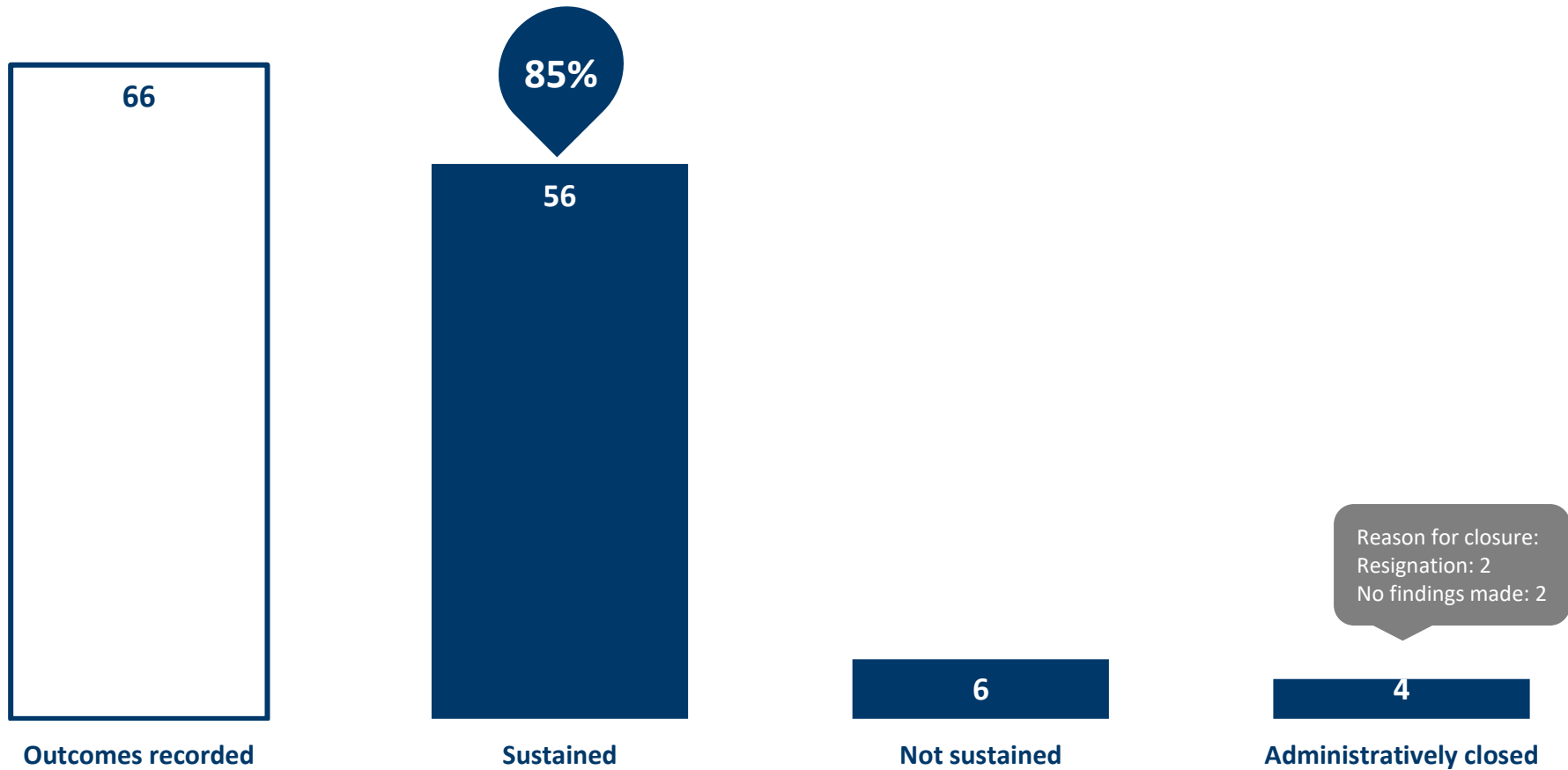

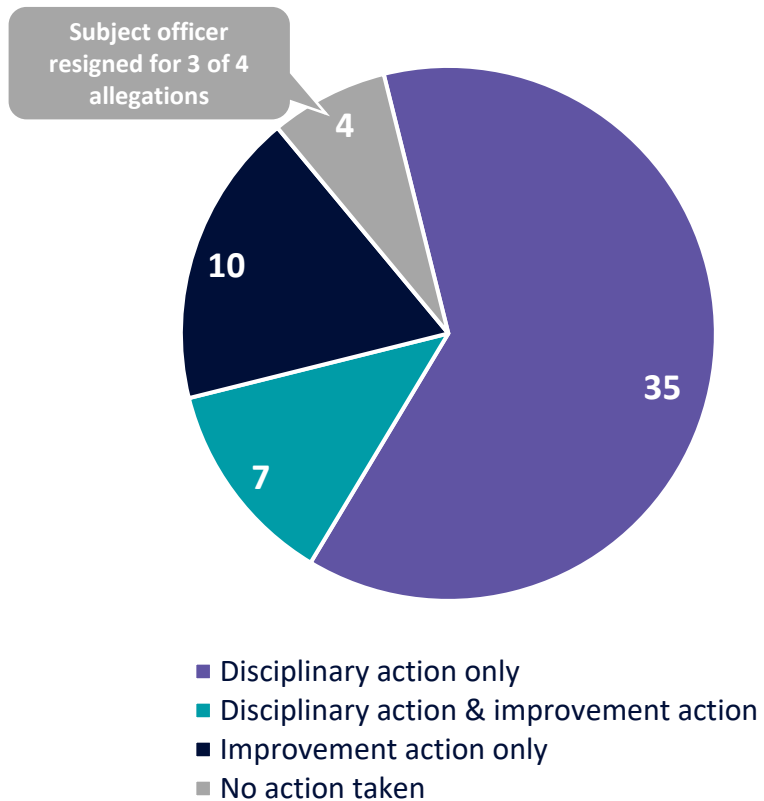
Outcomes recorded

The Commission recorded agency investigation outcomes for 66 allegations of serious misconduct during the quarter. Of these, over four-fifths (85%) were sustained.





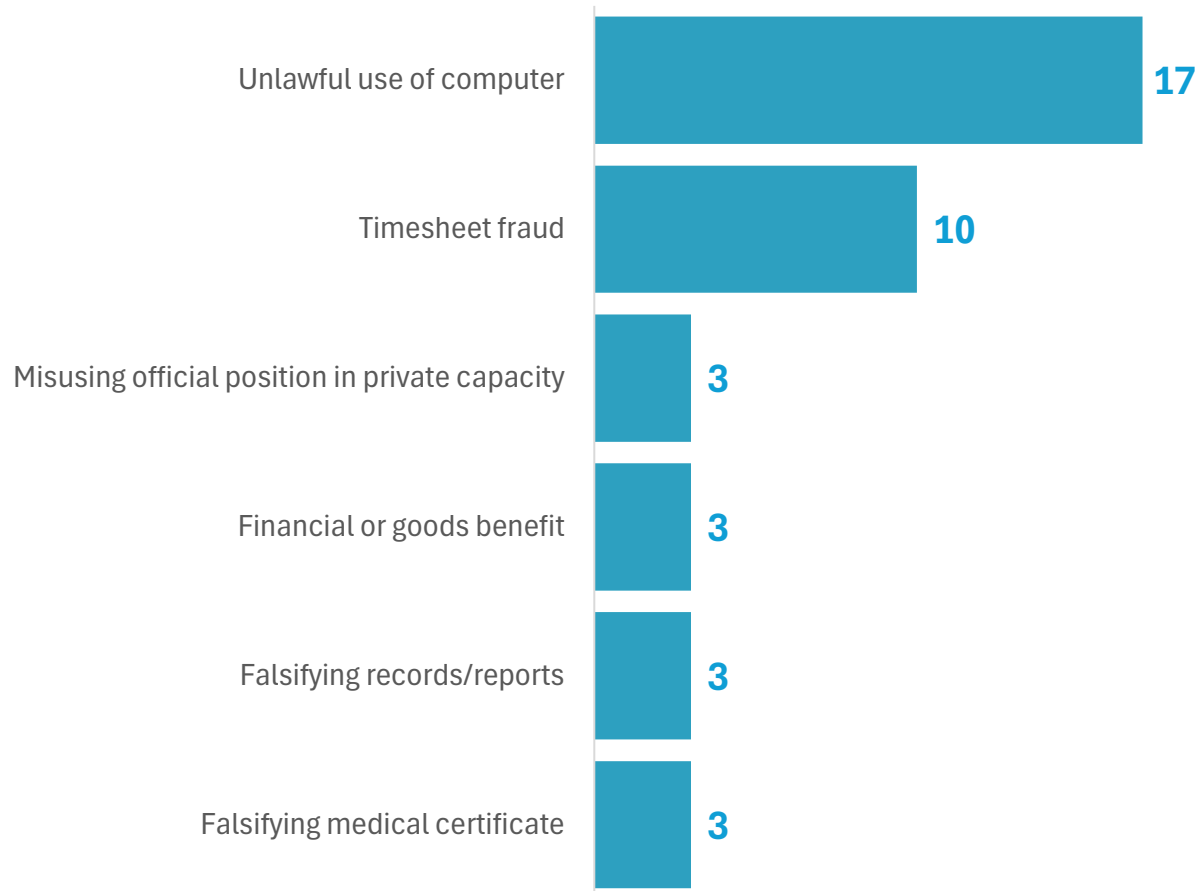
Response to sustained allegations



Sustained allegations (n=56)

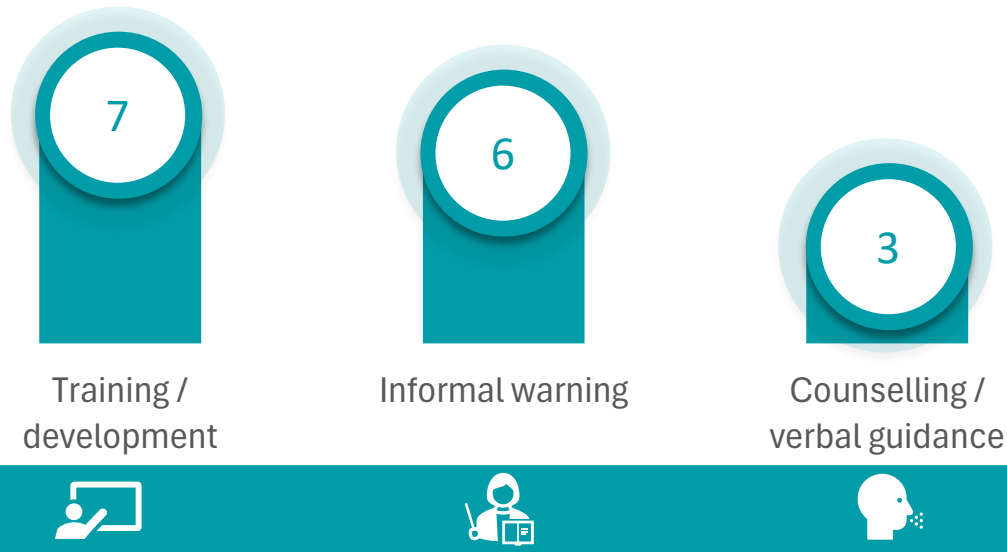


Sustained allegations by allegation category

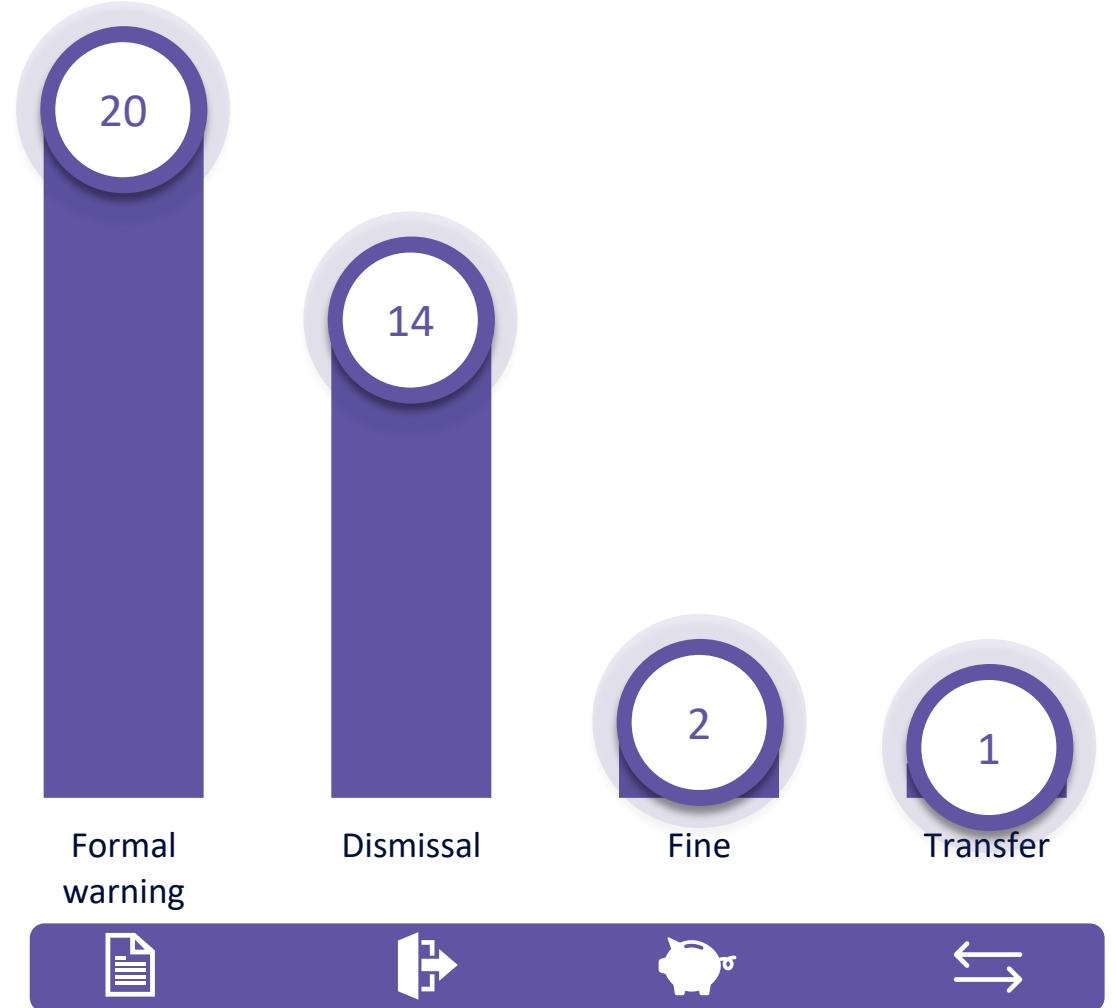

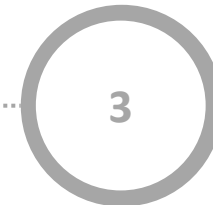

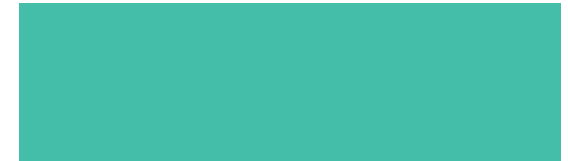

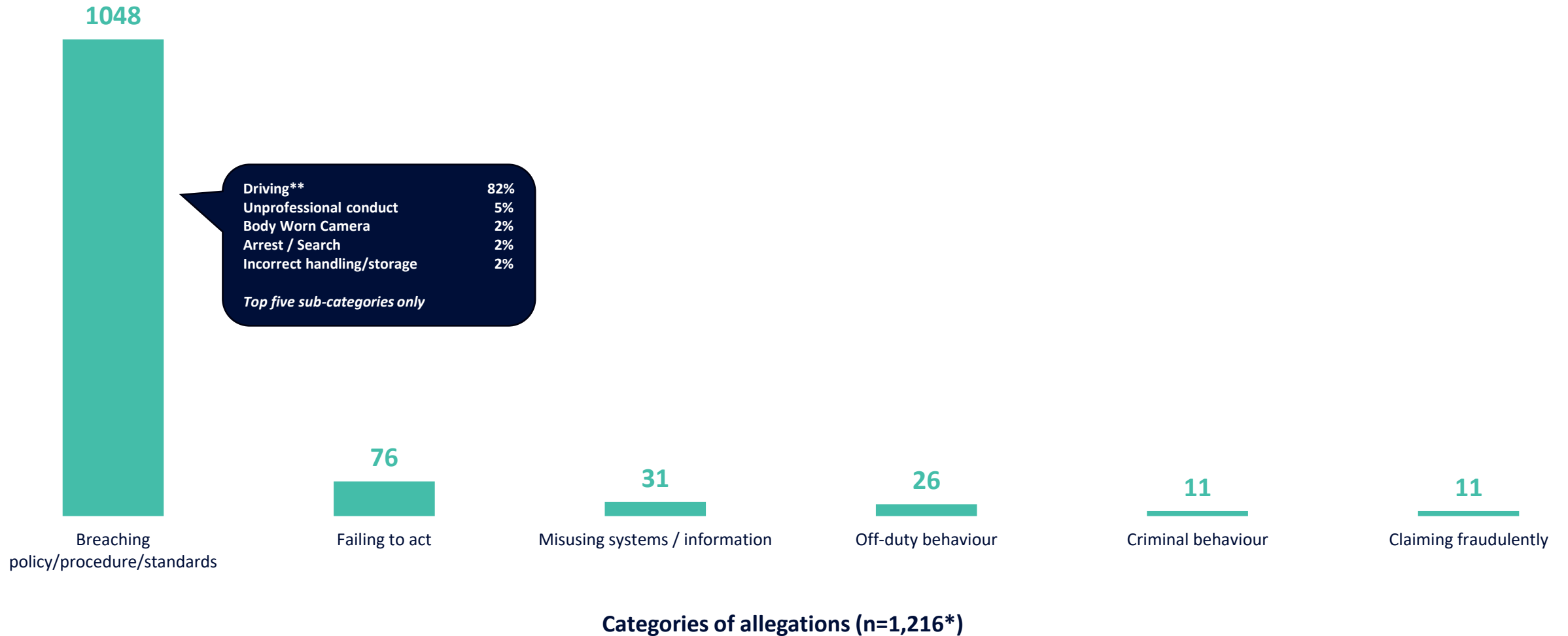

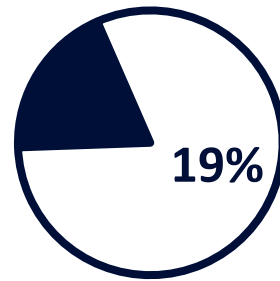

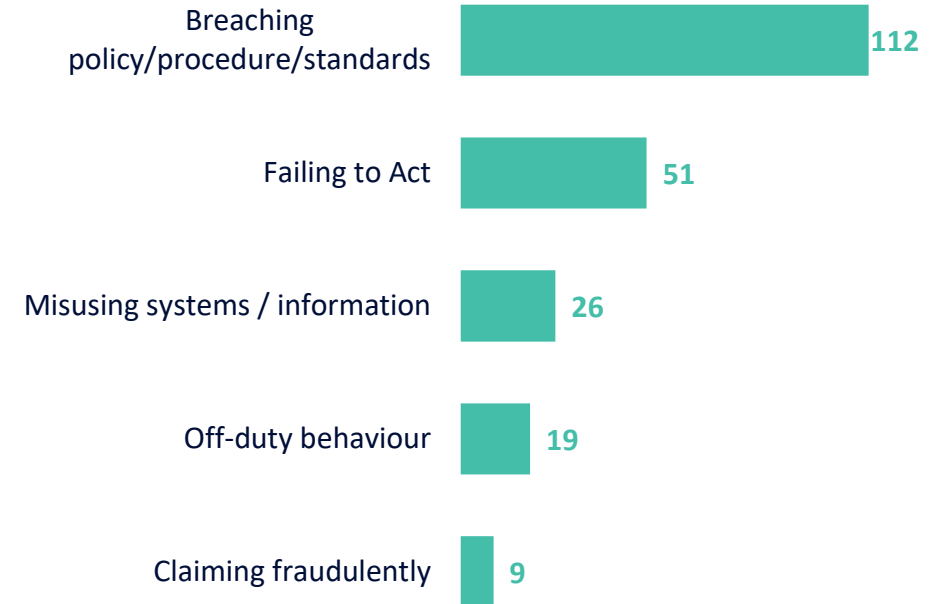

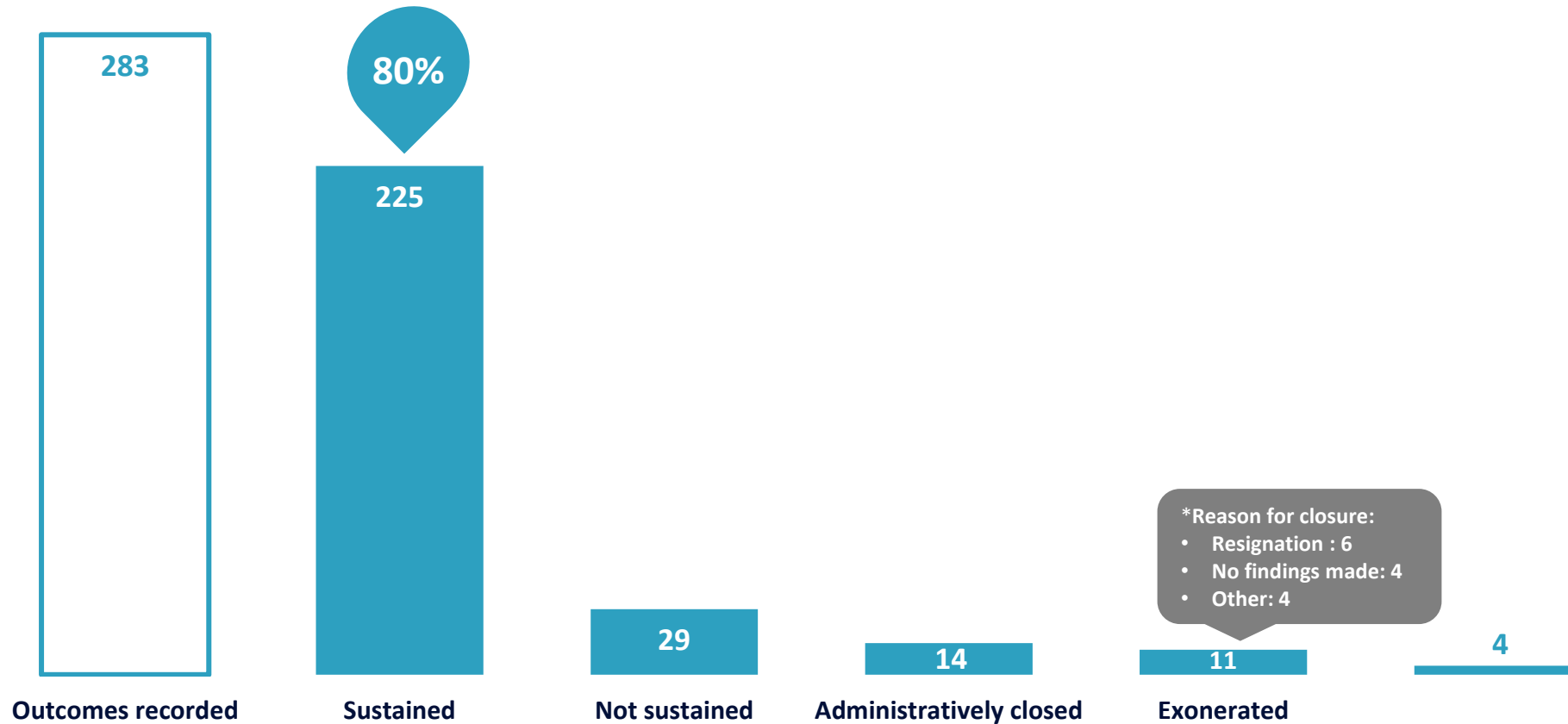

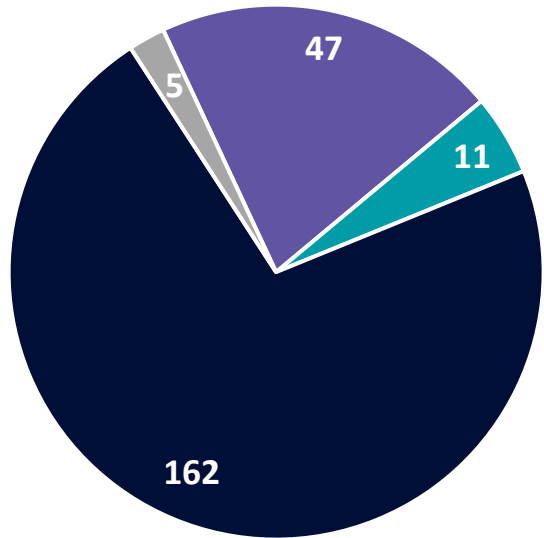

Response to sustained allegations (by count)

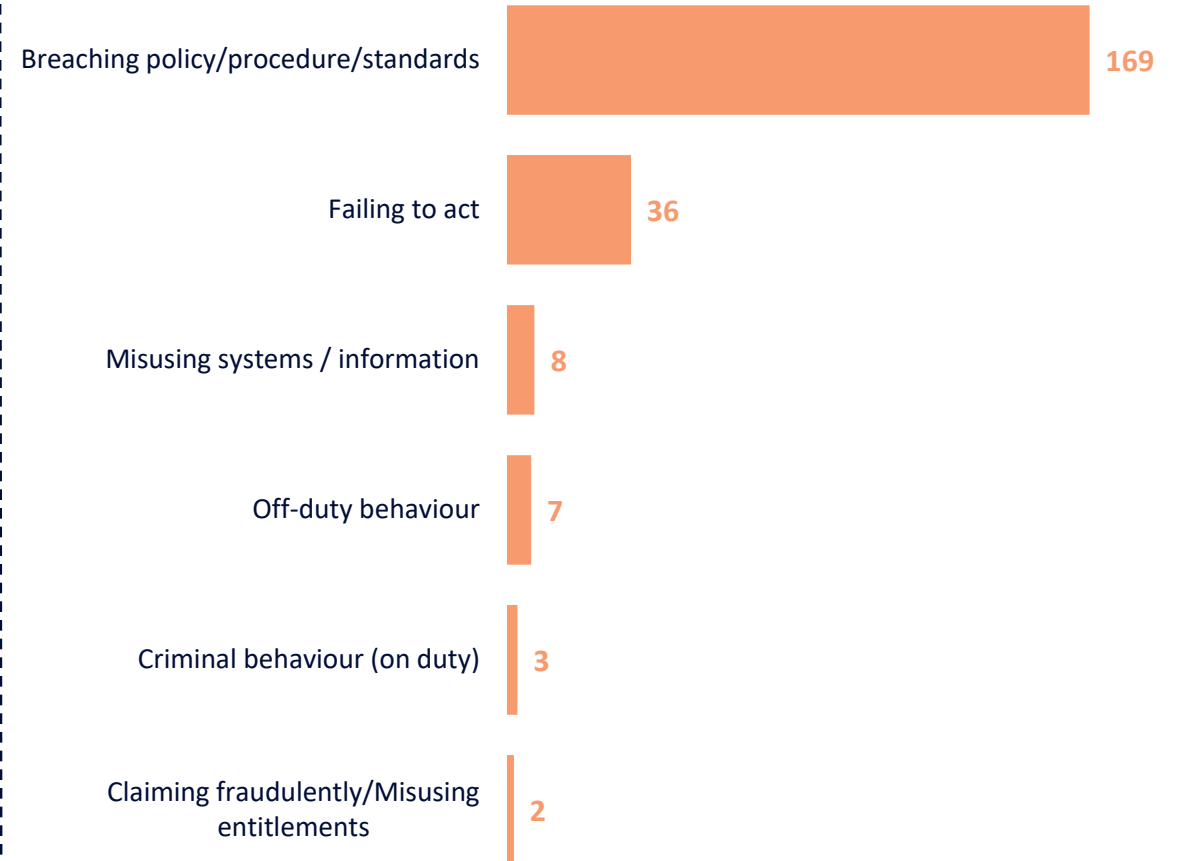

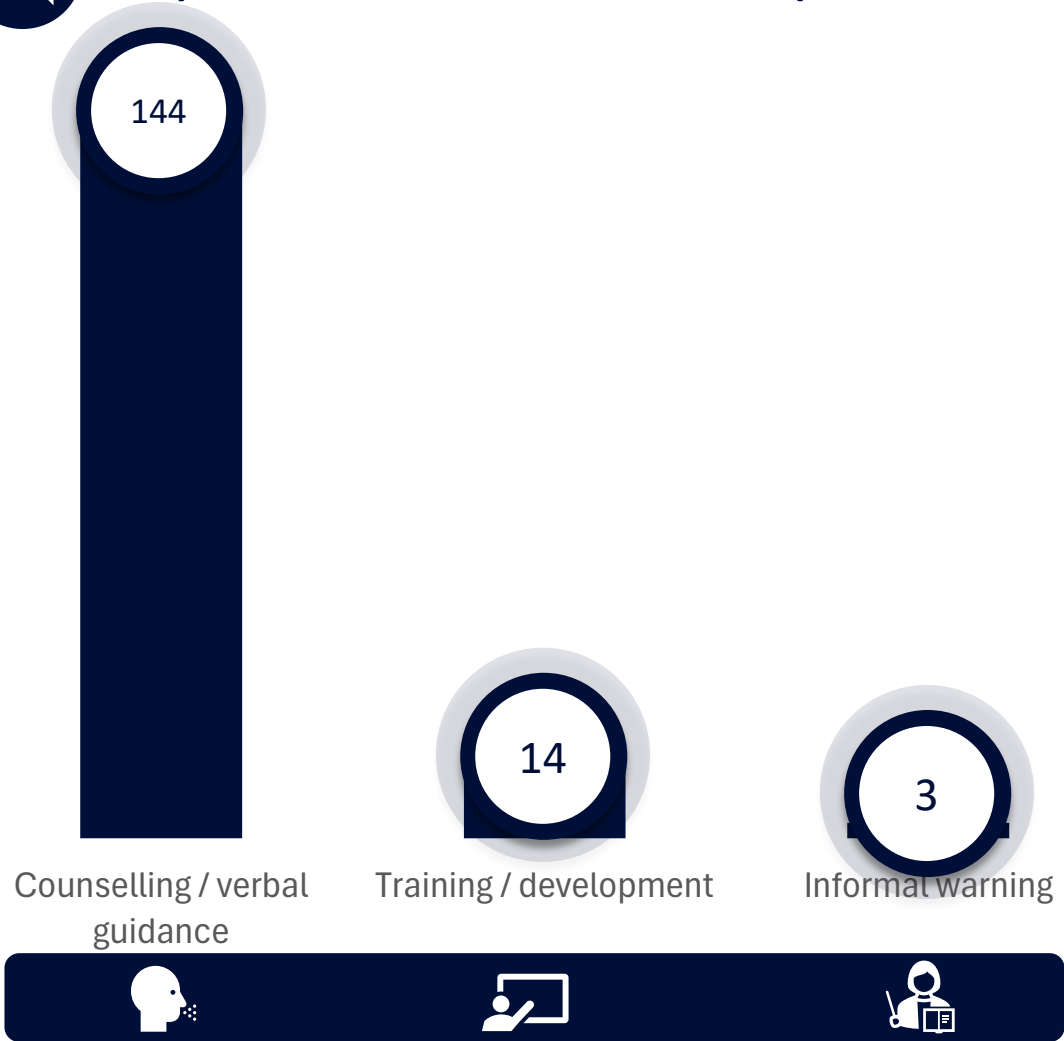


Categories of sustained allegations*

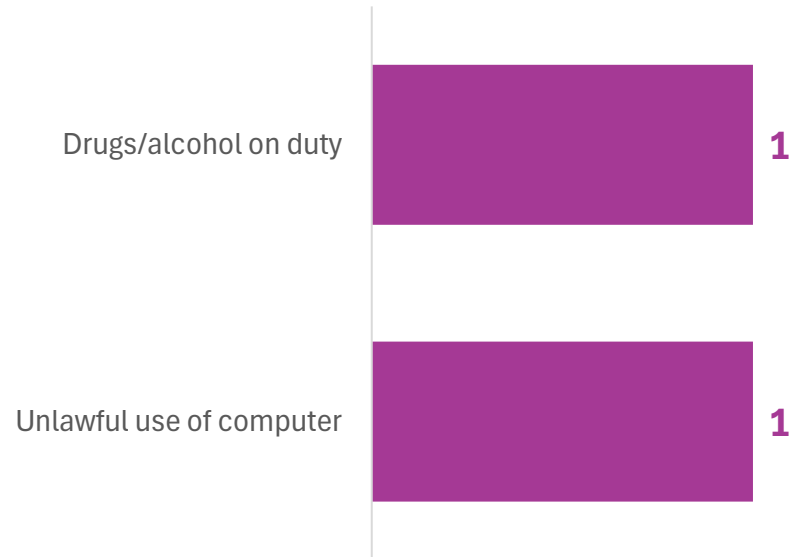

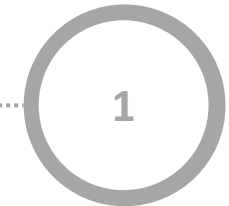
